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I have experience working in private and public settings. I am experienced in the provision/facilitation of individual and group interventions and have training in CBT, Schema Therapy and ACT. I am experienced in treating a variety of issues including substance related disorders, mood disorders, anxiety disorders, stress management, low self-esteem, anger management, interpersonal skills, and a range of offending behaviours.

Since completing my postgraduate degree in Forensic Psychology, I have maintained employment within the Criminal Justice System. At the Magistrates' Early Referral Into Treatment program (MERIT) I worked with Local Court defendants who were experiencing substance abuse and other psychological issues. My role included assessment, brief therapeutic interventions, preparation of court reports and participation in Local Court. I joined Corrective Services NSW (CSNSW) in 2009. Initially I worked with remand inmates at risk of harm to self and/or others. Following this, I worked within CUBIT, a therapeutic community for men who have committed sexual offences and who are considered high risk of re-offending. Within this role I was responsible for assessing the risk of sexual and general reoffending and providing treatment.
