Work Experience

Primarily, my experience has been in the not-for-profit sector, working as a Psychologist, family counsellor, and family dispute resolution practitioner. In my previous role at the Pastoral Counselling Institute (PCI) I co-facilitated a community-based group treatment program for men who had committed child sex offences (2012 – 2016). I also managed PCI's clinical services and conducted psychological interventions and assessments for people experiencing symptoms of mental illness, reactions to stress and trauma, relationship problems, and compulsive sexual behaviour (pornography use). I have worked for Uniting Communities (aka Uniting Care) as a family dispute resolution practitioner, and as senior clinical supervisor for family and relationship counselling. I have extensive experience working with and within Christian church communities: I personally identify as a Christian and strive to respect and honour people's faith commitments and spirituality in my work. During my formal Clinical Psychology training I undertook placements with The Centre for Emotional Health Clinic (where I was also employed as a research clinician treating people experiencing anxiety disorders), St George Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS / NSW Health), and LSC Psychology. Following completion of my doctoral program, I worked as a Research Assistant Professor at the University of Western Australia conducting research on intercultural competencies through studying and journeying with urban employees who were seconded into remote Aboriginal communities. I have also worked for Charles Sturt University on a research project for the Royal Commission into Institutional Child Sex Abuse.
